This book manuscript theorizes and defends a right to travel drawing on moral and political conceptions of human rights. It includes chapters that trace the concept of travel back in the history of political thought, explain that the moral and practical limits of the right to travel in non-ideal circumstances, and examine the normative implications of such a right for democratic politics.
